Tuberculosis and Bovine Brucellosis Testing 1) All animals entered for showing or exhibiting must

be from a current TB Clear Status Herd.
2) All animals entered for showing must be from a herd that is current with its TB testing requirements.
3) The Association must be notified within 48 hours, of any TB testing that results in potential TB issues being identified after entries have been submitted. This will

include TB testing of naimals associated with those entered for showing. Owners entering cattle must sign any declaration printed on the entry form.

4) All animals entered, that originate from a movement control area, must be notified at the time of entry. These animals if aged 90 days or older, must complete a clear pre movement TB test within 60 days of their movement to the show.

5) Animal Status Declaration Card. This is a legal requirement for all animals being moved. All animals entered must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated Animal Status Declaration Card showing a Clear TB status and required TB testing is complete.
6) A NAIT approved RFID tag will be mandatory for all movements of cattle, including day old calves. NAIT approved RFID cattle tags are white only. Please do not remove tags if cattle are identified with Animal Health Board or MINDA tags.

7) A secondary tag is no longer required under the new

NAIT scheme.

8) All animals being exhibited at the Show including any participating in a hoof and hooks carcass competition come under the standard identification and ASD regulations. These cattle will require the NAIT approved RFID tag.

9) Where live cattle or deer form part of a trade display the exhibitor is responsible for: (i) Ensuring all stock have completed all TB testing requirements as per Animal Health Board testing regulations. (ii) Ensuring all stock are identified in accordance with current legal requirements.

All ages of cattle to count from 1 June.

All entries for Cattle must be registered or eligible for their respective stud books.

New Rules as of 2015

The exhibiting of all Dairy Cattle in New Zealand is governed by the RAS Dairy Cattle Show Code of Ethics document. This document is Appendixes to the Additional Rules for Showing – Specific Sections.

Other Dairy Cattle show conditions outside of the RAS Dairy Cattle Show Code of Ethics are listed below: a) All groups and cows in milk in the Dairy Breeds to be judged first.

b) All Dairy Bulls two years and over must be rung, have two leaders and under adequate supervision.c) All Dairy Yearling Bulls must be rung and be under adequate supervision

d) All cows three years of age and over, that have been tested and have production records printed on the entry forms have their production records printed in the catalogues.

e) No records are necessary for maiden three-year-olds.

f) Points in the dairy section will be awarded as follows:

The steer is to be judged like any other cattle class, also taking into account the suitability of the animal for its productive use, i.e a red meat producing animal.

Steers are not to be swapped out at any stage of the season. Anyone found to be doing this will have all points deducted.

There will be no handlers classes.

Shows that have handlers classes already in their schedule, it would be great if those old enough can take their steers in these classes.

A round robin format for the championship will be run.

Scores will be allocated according to placings at each show.

For entrants to be eligible for the overall championship they must compete at 3 shows, with mandatory showing at Canterbury A&P.

If you compete at more than 3 shows, your best 3 will count toward your overall points.

The Grand Final Prize giving will be held at the Oxford A&P Show. (Note, you do not have to compete or take

your steer to Oxford to be eligible if you have competed at 3 other shows).
